UPDATE ON SCHOOL

“Check in, Catch up and prepare for summer and September” sessions.

29/6/20



The purpose of this update is to provide information for parents/guardians of children in Ysgol Llannon on how the decision to re-open schools on Monday 29th June 2020 will be implemented in our School.

Many of the measures we have had to take are based on what is required of us by the Welsh Government and Local Authority. It has been necessary to interpret the guidance as it applies to our school both in terms of the layout of the school/space available to us and staffing levels.

A set of 'Frequently Asked Questions' have been prepared in an attempt to answer as many of the questions you may have as we can. If you have any additional questions which we have not thought of please let us know by emailing LangabeerM6@hwbcymru.net and we will look to issue a second update. The more we can answer in this way will help minimise the number of individual queries being made directly to the School which will enable us to focus all our efforts on the safe re-opening of the School in the interests of pupil and staff safety.

Dates / Times

On what date will the School re-open?	Monday 29 th June 2020
On what date will the School close for the summer holidays?	Friday 24 th July 2020
What time will School start in the morning?	8:50am for 9:00am start.
What time will School end in the afternoon?	3:30pm finish
Will I be able to use breakfast club? If Yes, what time will breakfast club be open?	The Breakfast Club will NOT be available in any school.
Will there be an After School Club?	No. However, Menter Cwm Gwendraeth Elli who run Llannon Clwb Gofal are making plans to open the after school club in September.

What are the arrangements for September 2020?	It is unclear at the moment what the situation will be in September.
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Arrangements for School drop offs and pick ups

Is there any change to how children will be dropped off at School in the morning?	<p>Only one parent/guardian will be able to drop off. Older pupils will be expected to walk in from the main gate independently.</p> <p>You are asked to respect social distancing principles at all times.</p> <p>Children will enter through the pedestrian entrance. Parents of younger pupils can accompany them to the main entrance while adhering to social distancing.</p> <p>In order to maintain a one way system, parents will follow the signs along the pedestrian path and leave following the path through the car park parallel to the park.</p>
Is there any change to how children will be collected in the afternoon?	<p>Younger pupils will exit from their usual exit, where they can meet parents and then follow the one way system through the car park to exit on the path which is parallel to the park.</p> <p>Key stage 2 pupils will be led by their teachers through the kitchen gate entrance and will follow the path parallel to the park to meet parents at the gate.</p> <p>Only one parent/guardian will be able to collect children.</p> <p>You are asked to respect social distancing principles at all times.</p>

Providing care for children of key workers

Is there any change to the current provision of hubs by the Local Authority for care to be provided for children of key workers?	<p>We will do our utmost to offer care/hub sessions for those who have already had to use Hubs. Please note that parents should still make every effort to care for children at home at this time. However, with a capacity number of only 26 we will not be able to meet everybody's needs. These sessions will run in parallel to the check in and catch up sessions and run from 9am to</p>
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	3:30pm
If my child will be attending School for one day a week, will they be able to attend the 'Hub' for the remaining days?	Despite our very low capacity, we will aim to ensure places for children of key workers on certain days from 9am to 3:30pm. However, as many parents are key workers we will not be able to accommodate everybody's needs.

School Meals/Drinks

Will School lunches be provided? If no, are we to send in a packed lunch?	No school lunch will be provided. This includes pupils who receive Free School Meals, as payment is made directly to families now. Pupils will be expected to bring a packed lunch which includes food items with packaging they can open themselves. Pupils will eat their packed lunch in their classrooms or if weather permitting, outside.
Will there be fruit to purchase for morning break?	No. Pupils can bring their own fruit in their lunch boxes to be eaten at morning break time.
Will a pupil be able to top up their water bottle with water from the fountain?	No. Pupils will need to bring in a full water bottle.
I am in credit on Parent Pay for school meals will this be refunded?	Overpayments have been credited. However, please check and pay any outstanding debts.

Break times

Is there any change to how breaks will be managed?	Breaks will be staggered with each class having their own play area. Pupils will need to follow social distancing rules.
What precautions will be in place during break times to ensure social distancing principles apply?	Each class (maximum of 7 pupils) will be allocated an outdoor area to play in. Staff will remind pupils of social distancing.

Social Distancing / Hygiene/ Toilet Facilities

What measures have been taken to ensure social distancing applies to classroom layouts?	Desks have been removed from classes leaving only the desks required for the allocated number of pupils in each class. These desks will be placed to ensure each pupil is socially isolated by 2 metres.
What arrangements are in place for regular hand washing / use of hand sanitiser?	There will be clear signage around the School on the importance of hand washing, hygiene and maintaining social distancing. Outside sinks will be set up for pupils to wash their hands on entry to school.

Has the School been cleaned prior to the children returning?	Yes. The school has had a deep clean.
How often will the School be cleaned following the return of the children?	The School will be thoroughly cleaned every evening. Cleaning regimes will be significantly enhanced, with regular cleaning of frequently touched surfaces, door handles, toilets etc
Will the children be using shared learning resources e.g. iPad, pens, whiteboards etc?	No each pupil will have their own equipment- pens, pencils, rules etc. After using digital devices- ipad, chrome book – they will be wiped down with wipes.

Pupil Numbers

How many children are there in the School?	102
How many children confirmed that they wanted to return for a 'Check In and Catch Up' sessions?	77
How has it been determined how many children can attend school on any given day of the week?	We can only accommodate 26 pupils in school on any given day. This has been calculated following a robust Health and Safety risk assessment by the local authority taking into account the social distancing principles which have to be maintained.
Which classrooms will be used during this period and how many desks/pupils are allowed in each of these rooms?	Mr Edwards' Classroom = 3 pupils Creative Room = 3 pupils DT Room – 3 pupils Reception Class – 7 pupils Cabin 1 – 5 pupils Cabin 2 - 5 pupils However, these could be subject to change.
If my child is only likely to attend school one day a week and I have problems with childcare. What are my options?	We will do our utmost to offer care/hub sessions from 9am – 3:30pm. However, with a total capacity number of 26 and over 55 parents who are key workers, we will unfortunately not be able to meet everybody's needs. These Hub/care sessions will run in parallel to the check in and catch up sessions and run from 9am to 3:30pm
How many reception and Year 1 or Year 2 pupils will be in School at any one time?	7 pupils - Reception or Year 1 or Year 2 pupils at any one time for a session. On the advice of the Local Authority - Foundation Phase pupils - Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 pupils will be offered half day sessions – morning or afternoon. As this is a phased return for a check in and catch up session Foundation Phase pupils will not return until the third week i.e. week

	beginning 13 th July 2020
How many Key stage 2 pupils will be in School for check in and catch up sessions at any one time?	10 in total- 5 in each cabin
When and how will I be informed which day of the week my child will attend School?	You will receive a text message from the school's texting system.
I have more than one child in the School in different year groups is it possible for them to be scheduled to attend on the same day?	We will aim to arrange for siblings to attend on the same days where possible.

School Uniform / Bag

Will the children wear school uniform?	Pupils will not be required to wear school uniform. Please ensure clean clothes are worn each time they attend. Pupils are expected to wear clothes suitable to go outdoors in all weather- trainers, coat etc
Should my child bring a school bag, pencil case etc?	No. All equipment required will be supplied. Each pupil will have their own set of equipment which will be used only by them.
Should my child bring a PE kit to School?	No. Your child will need to wear suitable clothing for PE and outdoor lessons ever time they attend.

Lessons

What is the purpose of the 'Catch Up and Check In' sessions ?	Attending school for one or more sessions a week will be beneficial for all pupils as it will be an opportunity for them to meet their teacher and see some of their peers within their own school surroundings There will be a key focus on well-being during this time.
On the days my child is not in school will there still be work set on-line?	Yes, but please be mindful that teachers will be teaching daily and unable to respond to pupil's e mails or queries.
Will my child be issued with reading books?	If your child requires new reading books please advise their class teacher and they will be placed in the main entrance for collection.
Should my child's reading	No, not at the moment. Please keep safe for

books be returned to School when finished with?	returning at a later date. However, during the last week of Summer term a box will be placed in the main entrance for Year 6 to return their reading books, musical instruments- brass and woodwind etc
If the weather is favourable will some lessons be outside?	Yes. Pupils will spend time out doors as this is considered to be a lower risk environment. Suitable clothing will be required – trainers, waterproof coat etc.
What is happening to musical instrument lessons? Will these continue?	At present we are not sure as all staff were redeployed to other roles. As soon as we know we will inform you.
Am I entitled to a refund for the musical instrument lessons which have been paid for in advance?	Yes if no lessons are provided during the summer term.

Attendance

Will I be fined for not sending my child back to school for the catch up and prepare for summer and September sessions?	Parents will not be fined or penalised for not sending their child to school during the last 4 weeks of term. We respect each individual family's decision during the period 29th June to 24th July.
I've changed my mind and I no longer intend for my child to come in to School for check in and catch up sessions. Do I need to let you know?	Yes please e mail: LangabeerM6@hwbcymru.net as soon as you can noting name and year and that they are not attending check in and catch up sessions.
What if my child develops symptoms of COVID-19 during school hours? What steps will be taken?	If a pupil shows symptoms of Covid-19 whilst in school, there will be an isolation room made available for them. Parents will be contacted and expected to collect their child from school immediately. All areas where this person has been will be identified and a thorough clean down will occur prior to reoccupation, in line with Welsh Government guidance.

Will there be an end of year school report produced this year?	You will receive an end of year school report on your child's progress This will include attendance up to 20 th March.
