

YSGOL LLANNON  
 UPDATE ON RETURNING TO  
 SCHOOL IN SEPTEMBER

16/8/20



The purpose of this update is to provide information for parents/guardians of children in Ysgol Llannon on how the decision to re-open schools in September. Many of the measures we have had to take are based on what is required of us by the Welsh Government and Local Authority. It has been necessary to interpret the guidance as it applies to our school both in terms of the layout of the school/space available to us and staffing levels.

A set of 'Frequently Asked Questions' have been prepared in an attempt to answer as many of the questions you may have as we can. The more we can answer in this way will help minimise the number of individual queries being made directly to the School which will enable us to focus all our efforts on the safe re-opening of the School in the interests of pupil and staff safety.

**Dates / Times of staggered start to the new school year.**

<p>Why are some school years returning to school before other year?</p>	<p>Schools are expected to have a staggered start to the school year before reaching full capacity on September 14<sup>th</sup>.  Year groups that are moving classes- year 3 and year 5 and pupils who are starting school - will start school first in order to get to know their new surroundings and structures that are know in place- entry and exits to toilets, library, moving from cabins into school etc  All pupils will return to school by September 7<sup>th</sup>.</p>
<p>Why are Year 3 pupils back for 2 day before year 4?</p>	<p>Year 3 need to adjust to their new classroom in the cabin, including knowing how to move from the cabins into school to access the library, toilets etc  Also Year 3 will move from the Hwb learning platform to Google Classroom and therefore the teacher will need to ensure that they can confidently access and use their new platform.  All pupil will return to Llannon School on September 7<sup>th</sup>.</p>
<p>What time will School start in the morning?</p>	<p><b>Drop off times:</b>   <b>Foundation Phase- 8:55am</b>   <b>Key stage 2-8:45am</b></p>
<p>What time will School end in the afternoon?</p>	<p><b>Pick up:</b>   <b>Foundation Phase- 3:10pm</b>   <b>Years 3 and 4 – 3:20pm</b>   <b>Years 5 and 6 -3:30pm</b></p>
<p>Will I be able to use breakfast club? If Yes, what time will breakfast club be open?</p>	<p>Breakfast Club will not be available in school. As soon as we have more information on staffing for supervision I will let you know.</p>
<p>Will there be an After School Club?</p>	<p>No not until September 14<sup>th</sup>.  However, Menter Cwm Gwendraeth Elli who run Llannon Clwb Gofal are making plans to re- open the after school club On September 14<sup>th</sup> .</p>

## Arrangements for School drop offs and pick ups

<p>Is there any change to how children will be dropped off at School in the morning?</p>	<p>Only one parent/guardian will be able to drop off. Older pupils will be expected to walk in from the main gate independently.</p> <p>You are asked to respect social distancing principles at all times.</p> <p>Children will enter through the pedestrian entrance. Parents of younger pupils can accompany them to the main entrance while adhering to social distancing.</p> <p>In order to maintain a one way system, parents will follow the signs along the pedestrian path and leave following the path through the car park parallel to the park.</p>
<p>Is there any change to how children will be collected in the afternoon?</p>	<p>Younger pupils will exit from their usual exit, where they can meet parents and then follow the one way system through the car park to exit on the path which is parallel to the park. Key stage 2 pupils will be led by their teachers through the kitchen gate entrance and will follow the path parallel to the park to meet parents at the gate.</p> <p>Only one parent/guardian will be able to collect children.</p> <p>You are asked to respect social distancing principles at all times.</p>

## School Meals/Drinks

<p>Will School lunches be provided? If no, are we to send in a packed lunch?</p>	<p>No school lunch will be provided until September 14th. This includes pupils who receive Free School Meals, as payment is made directly to families now.</p> <p>Pupils will be expected to bring a packed lunch which includes food items with packaging they can open themselves. Pupils will eat their packed lunch in their classrooms or if weather permitting, outside.</p>
<p>Will there be fruit to purchase for morning break?</p>	<p>No. Pupils can bring their own fruit in their lunch boxes to be eaten at morning break time.</p>
<p>Will a pupil be able to top up their water bottle with water from the fountain?</p>	<p>Pupils will need to bring in a full water bottle, which can be topped by in classrooms.</p>

I am in credit on Parent Pay for school meals will this be refunded?	Overpayments have been credited. However, please check and pay any outstanding debts.
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### Break times

Is there any change to how breaks will be managed?	Breaks will be staggered with each class having their own play area.
What precautions will be in place during break times to ensure social distancing principles apply?	Each class will be allocated an outdoor area to play in. Staff will remind pupils of social distancing.

### Social Distancing / Hygiene/ Toilet Facilities

What measures have been taken to ensure social distancing applies to classroom layouts?	Desks have been re-organised to face the front of classrooms.
What arrangements are in place for regular hand washing / use of hand sanitiser?	There will be clear signage around the School on the importance of hand washing, hygiene and maintaining social distancing. Outside sinks will be set up for pupils to wash their hands on entry to school. Sanitising stations are set up outside toilets and in classrooms.
Has the School been cleaned prior to the children returning?	Yes. The school has had a deep clean.
How often will the School be cleaned following the return of the children?	The School will be thoroughly cleaned every evening. Cleaning regimes will be significantly enhanced, with regular cleaning of frequently touched surfaces, door handles, toilets etc
Will the children be using shared learning resources e.g. iPad, pens, whiteboards etc?	No each pupil will have their own equipment- pens, pencils, rules etc. After using digital devices- ipad, chrome book – they will be wiped down with wipes. If pupils want to bring in their own pencils cases etc from home then they will have to leave them in school.

I have more than one child in the School in different year groups is it possible for them to be dropped off and picked up at the same time?	Yes please drop off and pick up at the earliest time.
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## School Uniform / Bag

Will the children wear school uniform?	<p>Yes. Pupils will be required to wear school uniform.</p> <p>Pupils are expected to bring a waterproof coat and wear waterproof shoes suitable to go outdoors in all weather.</p> <p>Foundation phase pupils- please bring wellingtons and waterproof trousers and coat that can be left in school. Please label clearly with your child's name.</p>
Should my child bring a school bag, pencil case etc?	No. All equipment required will be supplied. Each pupil will have their own set of equipment which will be used only by them. If pupils want to bring in their own pencils cases etc from home then they will have to leave them in school.
Should my child bring a PE kit to School?	No. pupils can wear their PE kit to school – white T shirt, school jumper and navy leggings, shorts etc to school on the day they have PE lessons. Foundation Phase- Wednesday Key Stage 2- Tuesday

## Lessons

Will my child be issued with reading books?	Yes your child will have new reading books.
Should my child's reading books be returned to School when finished with?	Yes please place in the box which will be placed in the entrance of their classrooms.
If the weather is favourable will some lessons be outside?	<p>Yes. Pupils will spend more time out doors as this is considered to be a lower risk environment. Suitable waterproof clothing will be required – wearing waterproof shoes and bringing a waterproof coat.</p> <p>Please could all Foundation Phase pupils bring in their wellingtons and waterproof- coat and trousers to leave in school. Please label all clothing and wellingtons with child's name clearly.</p>
What is happening to musical instrument lessons? Will these continue?	At present we are not sure. As soon as we know we will inform you.

## Attendance

Will I be fined for not sending my child back to school for the catch up and prepare for	All pupils are expected to return to school by September 14 <sup>th</sup> . However, The Welsh Government's view is that it would not be
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summer and September sessions?	appropriate for a local authority/school to issue a Fixed Penalty Notice (FPN) or commence proceedings for non-attendance at the school. The Welsh Government will monitor the situation over the first half term before reviewing its position.
What if my child develops symptoms of COVID-19 during school hours? What steps will be taken?	If a pupil shows symptoms of Covid-19 whilst in school, parents will be contacted and expected to collect their child from school immediately. All areas where this person has been will be identified and a thorough clean down will occur in line with Welsh Government guidance. Parents will need to book a test and ensure their child self isolates until they receive the test results.
